Here are some specifics on the Units.

- b. The Pretest: Let's figure out what you know before I decide what "exactly" to teach. Consequently, my 2 sections might end up VERY different. Big discovery from last semester everyone was a plagiarizer.
 - i. Topics VG-- In-vitro gametogenesis, Medical Marijuana utility, the <u>Surgeon general</u> declares "social media" a public health threat, the AMA's legitimacy in defining guns as a "public health threat, and the neuro-psych of making college a transformative experience versus gateway to alcoholism..."
 - ii. From your pretests, I'll compile a master list of issues that I find in your writing that affect your ability to earn an A+ on every college writing assignment through senior year honors

thesis. We'll also look at what you simply don't know about scientific argumentation, what you need to "<u>unlearn</u>" or need to avoid like last semester's abject plagiarism.

- iii. We'll redraft a pretest together, systematically.
- iv. Most of this unit grade will be <u>unlearning</u> the "<u>lore</u>" of HS genres/standardized models for writing.
 - You'll learn about why successful HS writers tend to be really poor college writers
 - b. You'll get a chance to work with a peer-mentor on my feedback and throughout the semester.
- c. The website dossier portfolio 10% of course. Project elements selected as "resume builders" -- See: http://www.bradleyhammer.com/105i/styled-7/ -- If you want a top summer internship, deadlines are imminent. Get to work ASAP!!
 - i. Last semester: REAL Issues with website "quality" and HW extra credit guarantees.
 - This semester, optional weekly (Saturday night) check-ins and optional/extra credit Sunday tutorials with peer mentors to keep progress on target
 - a. Completion of these extra credit help sessions and you can drop bottom 5 HW grades and keep ONLY top 5.

15. My 27 promises: Turn on projector

- Even though I've done this 120+ times, I'll bring it, ever day!
- I'll see you as unique and not prejudge anyone. I'll only judge your work. But, at times, my criticism on your work will be biting and it might feel personal. It's not!
 It's always and ONLY about your work. Try to remember this!
- Anyone who's willing to put the time in and wants to earn an "A" I'll work with you. My office/Peer mentors, etc.
- You'll learn more in the next 6 weeks than in your 13 years of pre-college English education combined.
- You'll do well if you just do your work, exactly as I assign it. But, feel free to challenge me BEFORE it's due.
- All HW will have a purpose if not, speak up and don't do it.
- Group work may or may not go well -- but, grades will be fair! See nonnegotiable rules in syllabus and honor code violation issues for students who don't do their share of group work.
- Between your classmates and peer-mentor, you'll make the best set of friends you can find at UNC.
- Attendance matters: Only 3 students since 1989 have flunked my class. In all 3 cases, it was an attendance issue. I've only given 4 C's. I am principally against them. However, hundreds of kids have dropped the class before they got the "C" b/c they found it too hard.
- If you take the class seriously, by semester's end, you'll be intellectually unrecognizable – you will prove this by Midterm II. That change will make you feel smart and powerful!
- If we work hard and stay on pace, we're set to finish the entire semester and final exam with one day of class left. That's 27 meetings from today! So, you'll have your grade for this class well before finals and can focus on other courses.
- I might slip and offend someone e.g., accidental use of a swear word if you're offended, speak up and I'll apologize, sincerely.
- I'll never tell you what to think or even HOW to think -- but we will earnestly examine the mechanisms of how you think/how you build logic/conclude.
- No one will get left behind unless it's your sincere and earnest goal to fail.
- When you're lost, raise your hand and I'll pause class to get you caught up. You
 can be sure that others are struggling with the same question.
- If you stay focused, raise questions in class, meet with your mentor, stop by office hours and do the homework -- you'll do well.
- If you do not speak/pay attention in class then you will lose your participation
 points which, will kill your grade and it will be too late at the end of the
 semester to make it up.
- The first few classes will be relatively stress free to get you acclimated. I'll introduce you to the main ideas and you'll get settled into the course. Then, it will get super hard, really quickly. It will stay hard for probably 6 to 8 weeks, as we go rapidly, building skills. You will get behind and be lost in the nomenclature—no worries, because you'll also come by my office and talk with your peer mentors and classmates on the **GroupMe** to get help. Then, you'll develop a big brain, feel really smart and academically strong, and we'll start to have really serious and deep conversations. Then, in the end, it will get easy again (unless

- you get behind). If you're slacking, forget it, you'll get lost by the middle of week 2. In that case, consider a different section, <u>now</u>.
- Somone will hear me say, over and over again, "don't use Al" and will take a chance anyway and get busted – buying themselves all expenses paid vacation to Honor Court. Just do your own work!
- You'll make friends and learn to count on each other as you speak in class, share group work, and use the GroupMe. This will NOT, at all, be like HS group work.
- Someone will get an incredibly low grade in class participation because they'll barely or NEVER talk in class and then scream, "unfair"... Be warned now.
- HW will <u>always</u> be due the night BEFORE class unless I give extensions? I will be generous with extensions if you stop by my office to discuss well in advance.
- I'll tell you to NEVER text me yet, 5 of you will do it anyway. I'll get really annoyed with the excuse you made up for why you feel you had to and/or thought that, in your case, it what ok. We'll discuss and move on. Never to text again...
- Grading is inherently unfair so, talk with me about issues/concerns/difficulties as grades get posted. I'll let you redo/rework ANYTHING for a higher grade until the penultimate week of class if you meet with me first in office hours.
- One of you will get really upset when your grade goes from an "A" to an "F" b/c you had an unexcused absence.
- All HW can be done alone or in pairs of up to 38 students and/or with your peer mentors. This will not be seen as a plagiarism issue if you <u>put everyone's name</u> <u>on it and the % they contributed</u>. Never put "we did an = distribution."
- If HW is late or you're unsure of something, call me (DO NOT text or email) don't just send the HW late and ignore the deadline, it will be a zero. Learn to face things and you can get an extension.
- If you want feedback on HW, get it in before the deadline. Otherwise, I (and your classmates) will move onward. I grade on a first-come, first-served basis. Early submissions get the best feedback.
- I won't be able to tell you EXACTLY what we're doing next week under each heading on the daily calendar because each set of class lecture notes will be written from my observations of your prior day's HW.
- This class, if taken seriously, will radically alter both your academic success at UNC and your trajectory toward medical, dental, graduate school. If I fail you in this endeavor, I will use the last day of class to publicly apologize to all of you for wasting your semester.
- I will treat you like adults—this can be both a good thing and a tough thing...
