* Paper Topic/Question:

Imagine you're an HPM Major — it's now senior year and you're in the Honors Program, registered for "HPM 692H Independent Honors Research." In this course, your final research project on "Public Health" is focused on college binge drinking. Consequently, your prof has asked you to examine: "What, if any causal link(s) exists between college drinking and a "truncated" life expectancy?" Simply, she asks "where" (this is the intro concept you need to discover) is it possible that "binge drinking" behaviors lead DIRECTLY to "decreased life expectancy" or, indirectly to the types of diseases (i.e., physical — like perosis of the liver) or (i.e., pyscho-social — like depression) that secondarily alter life span? Put simply, what, if any public health implications exist for undergraduate students whose behaviors overly focus on alcohol consumption?

Here are the steps: You get 1 Hour to answer the question.

Step #1: Compile a Nomenclature List: Everyone read for 5-7 Minutes and build this list. As soon as you find something, paste the new word and its core meaning into your link below:
